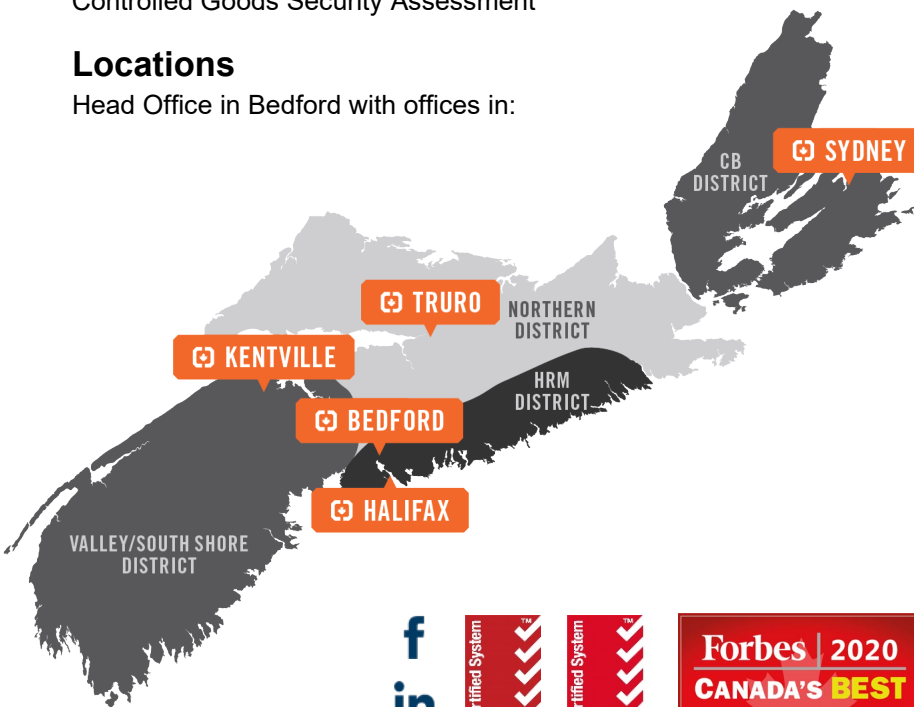

- Commissionaires Nova Scotia (CNS) is a member of Commissionaires, a federation of 15 independent divisions serving Canada from coast-to-coast
- Not-for-profit organization (95% of revenue goes back to employees in the form of wages and benefits)
- Largest private sector employer of veterans and provider of security services
- Employees offered health, drug and dental benefits, life and accident insurance, excellent training, free uniforms, and advancement opportunities
