Ottawa Mayor Jim Watson proclaims October 1st, 2014 "Commissionaires Ottawa Day"

City of Ottawa recognizes company's 75-year history

OTTAWA – Ottawa Mayor Jim Watson has proclaimed October 1st, 2014 "Commissionaires Ottawa Day" in honour of the private security company's 75th anniversary, veteran-focused social mandate and ongoing contributions to the safety and security of the City of Ottawa. The proclamation was formally announced by the Mayor at the Ottawa City Council meeting held on September 24, 2014.

Paul Guindon, CEO, Commissionaires Ottawa, says, "We are tremendously honoured by Mayor Jim Watson's proclamation on behalf of the City of Ottawa. Our company was formed to provide meaningful employment opportunities to former military personnel who were wounded or faced challenges finding jobs. - WHEREAS, since October 1st, 1939, *Commissionaires Ottawa* has grown to become one of the largest private sector employers in the National Capital Region, with more than 3,600 employees today and 23,500 employees hired over the past 75 years; and
- WHEREAS, since the Second World War, and through subsequent eras of war and peace, *Commissionaires Ottawa* has been dedicated to creating meaningful employment opportunities for Canadian Armed Forces and RCMP veterans of every age; and
- WHEREAS, Commissionaires Ottawa has introduced new security services to meet client demand, helped protect our freedom and peaceful way of life, and raised awareness and funds for military families through volunteer causes;
- THEREFORE, I, Jim Watson, Mayor of the City of Ottawa, do hereby proclaim October 1st, 2014 Commissionaires Ottawa Day.
