
Mobile Patrol & Alarm Response



COMMEMORATING KOREAN WAR VETERANS

July 27, 2023 marked the 70th anniversary of the signing of the Korean Armistice Agreement, which ended more than three years of conflict in the Korean Peninsula. In recognition of this important historical milestone, Commissionaires extends gratitude to the veterans of the Korean War, including some of our very own commissionaires.

Major (Ret'd) Gerry Ratchford is a commissionaire with our Victoria, the Islands and Yukon (VIY) Division. He is a respected Korean War veteran who served with The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment). Following over four decades in the Canadian Armed Forces, he began his second career with Commissionaires in 1980. At the age of 95, Gerry's remarkable dedication was honoured with a Commissionaires Distinguished Service Medal. Gerry was also recognized by Veterans Affairs Canada at a Korean War commemoration event in Burnaby, BC in July 2023.


